With its ten chairs working in close cooperation with the University of Heidelberg, the HfJS is a point of dynamic scholarly discussion, incorporating all facets of Jewish religion, history, cultures and societies.

While the proximity to the historical heritage of Ashkenaz provides decisive impetus for both academic and religious work at the Hochschule für Jüdische Studien Heidelberg, its interest invariably extends beyond to all areas of geography and chronology as to consider Jewish cultures at large.



What sets the HfJS apart from other Jewish Studies Institutions and Universities?

The Hochschule für Jüdische Studien Heidelberg has a Beth Midrash and a campus Rabbi, who also offers a wide array of courses for all students, regardless of their religious affiliation. The HfJS is also equipped with a kosher cafeteria, in which all internal and external students of Heidelberg can regularly eat together, even on special occasions, such as on various Shabbat evenings or select Jewish holidays. Additionally, the HfJS is a host and choice venue for multiple Jewish Student groups in the area, such as Hillel Hub Heidelberg (www.hillel-deutschland.de). Many of the Professors and Students thereby become easily involved in both the Jewish community and national associations.
